REGULATIONS

1. Students must take 42 credit hours of public health courses for the Master of Public Health, 23 credits of which come from the College of Veterinary Medicine.
2. Students must complete the entire Doctor of Veterinary Medicine curriculum, currently 132.5 credit hours of College of Veterinary Medicine courses, 23 credits of which are shared with the Master of Public Health Program.
3. A dual degree candidate who subsequently decides to pursue only one of these degrees must complete degree requirements subject to the same rules as a student not pursuing the dual degree.
4. Student honors and class ranks at the College of Veterinary Medicine will be computed based on classes enrolled in as Veterinary Medicine classes.
5. The Master of Public Health program and the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine program share the same grading scale and credit hours are calculated similarly in
6. Dual degree candidates must enroll in the Master of Public Health Program prior to the start of their third semester in the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine program. Likewise, Master of Public Health students who gain admission to the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine curriculum while enrolled as Master of Public Health students must enroll in the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine program prior to the start of their third semester in the Master of Public Health Program for consideration as dual degree students.
7. There will be a separate advisor and graduate committee for the Master of Public Health degree program. Committee structure and governance will be based upon standards defined for the Master of Public Health Program. Governance and administration of the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine component of the dual degree will remain unchanged.
8. There will be two separate diplomas awarded upon completion of all degree program requirements.
9. The Master of Public Health Program and the College of Veterinary Medicine reserve the right to limit participation in the program, including dismissal. Those interested in pursuing the dual degree program are encouraged to discuss the possibility with advisors in both units and to submit applications for admission at the earliest possible time.
10. Beginning with Summer semester 2009, all DVM students in the MPH Program **will not** be charged additional fees (beyond the usual DVM fees) for the 20 credit hours of shared DVM/MPH courses listed here: **V_BSCI 8509**: Veterinary Toxicology (3 credit hours), **V_M_S 8431**: Research Methods/Data Analysis (2 credit hours), **V_PBIO 8454**: Veterinary Virology (2 credit hours), **V_PBIO 8455**: Veterinary Epidemiology (2 credit hours), **V_PBIO 8457**: Veterinary Parasitology (3 credit hours), **V_PBIO 8458**: Veterinary Public Health (2 credit hours), **V_PBIO 8552**: Veterinary Bacteriology I (3 credit hours), and **V_PBIO 8553**: Veterinary Bacteriology II (3 credit hours). The shared course **P_HLTH 8971**: Veterinary Public Health Capstone (3 credit hours) **will** be assessed at the graduate student per-hour rate. Also, any other MPH courses taken beyond these 20 credit hours **will** be assessed at the graduate student per-hour rate. For semesters that are included in a year in which the DVM fees have covered incidental fees, additional incidental fees will not be charged. If graduate coursework extends to other semesters, the appropriate incidental fees will be assessed.
